

## CHAPTER 21

### MEDICAL AND HEALTH

21.1 Under the successive five year plans the State Government has been endeavouring to expand curative, preventive, promotive and rehabilitative services with special emphasis on rural population. During the Ninth Five Year Plan period a sum of Rs. 376.95 crores was spent on medical and health Department.

21.2 Determined and continued efforts made by the State Government to provide better health facilities have resulted in achieving the following :-

## **Minimum Needs Programme (MNP)**

21.4 In the State 2201 sub centres are working in make shift arrangement buildings. Construction of 400 sub centres building is proposed for Tenth Five Year Plan 2002-2007 for which a sum of Rs. 1600.00 lakhs is proposed.

21.5 Renovation & Modernisation of Rural Institution is proposed for Rs. 314.47 lakhs during Tenth Five Year Plan.

21.6 In our State requirement of opening of Sub centre in desert and tribal district is not fulfilled so 300 sub centre are proposed to open. For which Rs. 2442.00 lakhs are kept in Tenth Five Year Plan.

21.7 For Strengthening of sub-centres Rs. 34.50 lakhs are proposed in Tenth Five Year Plan by providing ANM and Rs. 4.60 lakhs are kept in Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.8 For the Working of PHC's Rs. 388.95 lakhs are proposed in Tenth Five Year Plan of which Rs. 14.02 lakhs are kept in Annual Plan 2002-2003 to increase beds.

21.9 It is proposed to provide 51 Ambulances in Tenth Five Year Plan 2002-2007 for which Rs. 204.00 lakhs has been proposed.

21.10 CHCs requires x-ray machine in Tenth Five Year Plan 2002-2007 for which Rs. 156.40 lakhs has been proposed.

21.11 200 Calory Meters have been proposed in CHCs for which Rs. 30.00 lakhs is kept in Tenth Five Year Plan @ 0.15 Calory meter.

21.12 Rs. 250.00 lakhs are proposed for METP in Tenth Five Year Plan for rural areas of which Rs. 50.00 lakhs are kept in Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.13 Provision of Rs. 600.00 lakhs is proposed for IEC during Tenth Five Year Plan of which Rs. 121.75 lakhs is proposed in Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.14 Provision of Rs. 60.00 lakhs is proposed for disastor management of which Rs. 15.00 lakhs is kept in Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.15 Provision of Rs. 496.00 lakhs is proposed for SIHFW of which Rs. 115.00 lakhs is kept in Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.16 Provision of Telephone at Dy. CM&HO's office has been proposed for Rs. 47.16 lakhs of which Rs. 7.64 lakhs is proposed in Annual Plan 2002-03.

## **Other than Minimum Needs Programme**

21.17 Renovation & Modernisation of hospitals building is proposed for Rs. 410.89 lakhs in Tenth Five Year Plan.

21.18 In Tenth Five Year Plan construction of District Hospital Building is proposed for which Rs. 10.00 lakhs are proposed in Annual Plan 2002-03.

21.19 Rs. 1705.00 lakhs is proposed for bio waste management in Tenth Five Year Plan of which Rs. 343.00 lakhs is proposed in Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.20 Strengthening of drug lab is proposed for Rs. 193.40 lakhs in Tenth Five Year Plan of which Rs. 26.78 is proposed in Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.21 Provision for METP is proposed for Rs. 184.89 lakhs in Tenth Five Year Plan .

21.22 Provision of Rs. 2750.00 lakhs is proposed for Jeevan Raksha Kosh of which Rs. 500.00 lakhs is proposed for Annual Plan 2002-03.

21.23 Provision of Rs. 1806.28 lakhs is proposed for strengthening of General Nursing Training Centres to fulfill the norms of Government of India of which Rs. 119.20 lakhs is kept for Annual Plan 2002-03 against requirement of Rs. 258.98 lakhs for eight months.

21.24 Provision for METP is proposed for Rs. 300.00 lakhs of which Rs. 50.95 lakhs is proposed for Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.25 Provision of Rs. 2750.00 lakhs is proposed for Jeevan Raksha Kosh of which Rs. 500.00 lakhs is proposed for Annual Plan 2002-2003.

21.26 Provision of Rs. 277.00 lakhs is proposed for Medical technology in district hospital of which Rs. 79.25 lakhs is proposed in Annual Plan 2002-2003.

### **Population Control & Family Welfare**

21.27 The main objective of the Family Welfare Department is to implement the family welfare programme. This programme is critical for the success of the plan. The goals of the department are as follows :

- to promote responsible parenthood with small family norm through independent choice of family planning method best suits to couple.
- promotion & wealth of mothers and children which in turn contributes greatly to acceptance of small family norm as a way of life.

21.28 In the State of Rajasthan, various programmes under the Family Welfare Department have been going on for the last few years. These are Vikalp Yojana, Social Safety Net Scheme, medicine sub-centres, opening of new Family Welfare Bureau and Pulse Polio Programmes. A sum of Rs. 2750.00 lakhs has been proposed for these programmes during Tenth Five Year Plan period of which Rs.500.00 lacs have been proposed for Annual Plan 2002-03.

21.29 State Government has constituted Rajeev Gandhi Population Mission which will monitor the progress of different interventions for population stabilisation in the State. The main objective of the Mission is to ensure the timely implementation of strategies and activities proposed under state population policy and achieve the time bound target set under the policy for which a sum of Rs.543.00 lacs has been proposed during Tenth Five Year Plan for the implementation of the scheme.

21.30 To motivate the couple to use the family planning methods, a Jan Mangal Scheme was introduced in the State. During Tenth Five Year Plan period a sum of Rs. 565.00 lakhs has been proposed of which Rs.15.00 lacs is kept for Annual Plan 2002-03.

## Mobile Surgical Unit

21.31 Mobile Surgical Unit provides medical facilities to rural masses in remote areas by organising camps with the help of the voluntary agencies or the local administration. An outlay of Rs. 292.17 lakhs was kept for Ninth Plan period as against a sum of Rs. 228.24 lakhs was incurred. A sum of Rs.196.02 lacs has been proposed for Tenth Five Year Plan of which Rs. 20.00 lacs has been proposed during 2002-03. During the Tenth Plan and Annual Plan 2002-03, 160 and 32 camps will be organised respectively.

## Medical Education

21.32 It is obvious that the effective delivery of the health care services to the community depends largely on the quality of education, training and proper orientation provided to the medical and health personnel. To achieve this objective, the 6 medical colleges are imparting Graduate & Postgraduate education in all the major specialities at Jaipur, Jodhpur, Udaipur, Ajmer, Bikaner and Kota. Reorganisation of medical education is also to be introduced/expanded. It is proposed to increase intake capacities of Kota Medical College from 50 seats to 100 seats. During Annual Plan 2002-03 a sum of Rs.70.00 lakhs has been proposed for the development of RRC at SMS Hospital, Jaipur under the recommendation of NHRC.

21.33 The total allocation for the Tenth Five Year Plan period (2002-07) and Annual Plan 2002-03 for medical education is given below :

## ESI

21.34 The Employees State Insurance is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme where the expenditure between the ESI Corporation and the State Government is shared in the ratio of 7:1. A new ESI Hospital at Bhiwadi has been proposed to open during 2002-03. Similarly, 2 new ESI Dispensaries will be opened at Makrana and Rishabhdev. For such new dispensaries, the ESI Corporation would meet 100% expenditure for 3 years from the inception of dispensary. A sum of Rs. 242.88 lakhs has been made during Tenth Five Year Plan period as State's share, of which Rs. 44.16 lakhs has been proposed under Annual Plan 2002-03. A sum of Rs. 25.00 lakhs have been provided for Special Cadre for E.S.I.

## Ayurved (Indigenous System of Medicines)

21.35 The Ayurvedic system of medicines is widely practised in the State. The State Government is giving special thrust to strengthen the department. At the time of formation of Rajasthan, the State had only 346 Ayurvedic hospitals and

homeopathic hospitals with a total bed - strength of 100. By the end of 2000-01, the number has gone up to 3733 hospitals and dispensaries with a total bed strength of 1186. Besides these, the state has 6 mobile dispensaries, 3 Ayurvedic College (including two private colleges) and 2 training centres for para-medical staff. The national institute of Ayurved is also located at Jaipur. An outlay of Rs. 1465.00 lakhs was allotted to the department during Ninth Five-Year Plan and expenditure to the tune of Rs. 1115.01 lakhs was incurred. An outlay of Rs. 1954.43 lakhs has been proposed for the Directorate of Ayurved and Rs. 75.90 lakhs for the Government Ayurved College, Udaipur during Tenth Five-Year Plan period. A sum of Rs. 355.35 lakhs has been proposed for Ayurved Department and Rs.13.80 lakhs is kept for Ayurved College for Annual Plan 2002-03. During Annual Plan, it is proposed to open 50 new dispensaries. A sum of Rs. 100.00 lakhs has been kept for opening of new University of Ayurved in Annual Plan 2002-03.
